Braden came with his family who were all proud that he was a candidate. As Carri Redmond, Club Director, was on stage with our twelve nominees, Braden stood proud and tall. Then his name was called, and his face turned to shock.

"I didn't think I was going to get it," his face lit up when telling a staff after the banquet. "I cannot believe it."

Braden, age 14, started attending the Club when he was 9. Braden can be found hanging out in the Games Room, participating in a Pool Shark tournament, and playing basketball in the gym. He was a top reader in the Education Center last summer, and he was the Walk Club winner two years in a row.

The Club for Boys is not the only place Braden shines. When hearing from others about Braden, everyone said that he is always kind to others. In addition, he is a leader in the classroom, on the court, and on the field. He participates in placing wreaths and flags on the grave sites at the National Cemetery, and takes the lead on doing an annual Easter Egg Hunt in his neighborhood, to name only a few things which make him our Boy of the Year.

Carri Redmond stated, "Braden is spectacular in all that he embodies. We see that at the Club, and it is the same everywhere he goes whether it is to church, school, sports, 4H, he has the same characteristics. He is very humble about all of this. He has won lots of awards here at the Club, and he is not one to boast about it. He is more about building up those around him versus 'hey look what I just won.'

Travis Koller, Junior Boys Director, explained, "Braden is one out of all the kids who come to the Club, which is hundreds or thousands. He really shows what we represent. He is fair, he is kind, he is always willing to help, and he is willing to participate in multiple activities. He is just a great example of what you want to see from somebody who comes down to the Club."

Growing STEM

LAST SUMMER, Tanner started at The Club for Boys as our Creative and Learning Specialist. His focus is to offer STEM, project-based learning activities to our members with our Education Program and throughout all areas of the Club.

Congratulations to Tanner on receiving his National STEM certification in April 2024!

Tanner has brought a new level of excitement into our Shop Program. Boys line up outside of the Shop door or look through his window to see what he is setting up for the day.


Tanner has brought some new and old activities back into the Shop. He has implemented a 3D printer, coding, stop motion, circuits, and more. He is bringing back plastics and woodworking, while giving the boys a safe place to utilize their artistic ability in activities like art, crafts, or painting.

With the certification, Tanner is now implementing daily stem activities. Imagination Mondays are a true highlight for our members. Imagination Mondays give boys the opportunity to problem solve, adapt to mistakes or hurdles, and build resiliency in completing a task. They are given the opportunity to build things with their mind, use creativity, and their education.

Tanner's influence goes beyond the Shop. He is spreading STEM, creativity, and learning throughout the Club by collaborating with different program areas. In April, he partnered with the Hideout (ages 10 - 12) and the Den (ages 12 - 17) to build bridges out of popsicle sticks. Each boy who participated got to see how much weight their bridge would hold and a winner was declared at the end. After the excitement of that collaboration, the boys are now excited to do an egg basket launch this summer.

"This new format, with our Shop program being an extension of our education program, is exposing our members to other elements that are not in the traditional education domain such as math, writing and reading," Gregg McNabb, Education Director stated. "It is using other parts of the brain that can show them that they can be successful while enhancing their math and reading. This uncaps the ceiling for what our boys might feel their career paths are limited to."


