

Some Call it Chaos, We Call it The Holidays

THE HOLIDAY SEASON at The Club for Boys is always full of memories. There are many activities going on in each program area, additional special events, gifts, laughter, full tummies, and teachable moments. Staff work hard to try and make this season extra special for everyone who walks through our doors.

At the end of October, there was a **Halloween Family Night** that usually kickoffs of our season. On this special night, Club members and their families dress up, can trick or treat, have a meal, and play games with everyone that they love. This family night is always our most well-attended. We had 125 different families attend with over 615 people.

Starting on November 1st, Club staff started to get ready for our Christmas Tree Project, our Christmas Family Program and our Flag Football league. The tree lot was set up, decorated, trees were delivered, and the boys were interviewed to be tree sellers. In addition, our families were called for their Christmas gift wishes. Our Christmas Tree Project sold almost 1,200 trees, raising over \$65,000 for our program. The Christmas Family Program helped 81 families, benefiting over 500 people. Our Flag Football league ended with 107 members participating.

Our Curbside Thanksgiving Dinner is always a blast for our staff and takes place on the Wednesday evening before Thanksgiving. Our Nutrition Program team worked all week long to make this Thanksgiving dinner special for our families, serving meals to 70 Club families. There was a total of 28 turkeys, 20 large bags of potatoes, 546 corn on the cobs, pumpkin bread, and lots of stuffing made. It is a highlight event for our staff and helpful to our families.

At the end of November, 967 boys had enrolled in our program this fiscal year with a daily average of 215. We had 549 different boys attend.

The Club for Boys offered its **annual family night in December to celebrate Christmas** with our families. This year, 103 families attended totaling 485 people. This was an increase in 30 families, and 125 people compared to the previous year. We had two special Christmas parties, one for our younger boys and one for our older boys. Each Christmas party gave our members the opportunity to play games and contests, have fun, and take one present home. This year, we had a community partner reach out, and we were able to get 31 members and their siblings new beds for home.

We ended December with **Spirit Week.** During that week, there were different games based on themes that encouraged our members to dress up and have fun on the week before they went back to school. One of the boys' favorite days during the week was Pancakes and Pajamas. Our younger boys also went out to visit residents at a nursing home singing them Christmas carols and giving them handmade ornaments and stuffed animals.

In December, The Club for Boys added 20 more members totaling 987, with a daily average of 202. We had 568 different boys attend.

In January, we welcomed them back to an exciting new year **kicking it off with a ski trip**. We had 8 boys try skiing, and for 7 of them this was their first time on the slopes. We hosted another family night, with a tailgate theme to get ready for the Superbowl. We had 95 families attend, totaling 420 people. This family night was the first night that boys could sign up for the basketball leagues and Hooked on Hardwater.

At the end of January, The Club for Boys had over 1,000 members enrolled in our program this fiscal year and a daily average of 201. We had 546 different boys attend.

All of this was not possible without The Club for Boys dedicated staff, volunteers, donors, and our community. We thank you for helping us make this season brighter every single year for our members.


